STATE TEXTBOOK COMMITTEE PASSES THE SENATE

Senator Orr's Senate Bill 54 will guarantee that periodicals used in K-12 schools are suitable for the classroom by requiring the State Textbook Committee to conduct regular reviews of the material. *The bill passed the Senate on Thursday*.





PARENT'S RIGHT TO KNOW BILL PASSES THE SENATE

The Parent's Right To Know Bill keeps families informed of the content of their children's education by requiring curricula to be posted on a school's public website. SB 48, sponsored by Senator Reed, passed the Senate on Thursday.

INCREASING DAM SAFETY BILL MOVES TO THE HOUSE

SB 39, sponsored by Senator Chambliss, provides safety procedures for state-owned dams and reservoirs, increasing public safety and ensuring the protection of communities surrounding these vital resources. SB 39 passed the Senate on Thursday.
